



**FACT SHEET 1
ECONOMY AND EMPLOYMENT**

The Plan ensures sufficient supply of suitable commercial sites and employment lands and creates more jobs in Western Sydney, closer to Sydney's geographic heart.

In 2031, the majority of jobs are likely to be located in strategic centres or employment lands, which will provide the basis for more sustainable and targeted infrastructure and transport planning.
